JULY 2023 NEWSLETTER

Summer is here! This month we are focusing on identifying numbers 1-20 and the following themes: Independence Day, Postal Worker Appreciation, Science Week, and Arts & Crafts Week.

Independence Day represents America's separation from British rule. Under British rule the Colonists felt they were unfairly taxed and had no voting rights on laws that affected them. On July 2, 1776 the Declaration of Independence was written and in 1801 the first 4th of July celebration took place at the White House.

Postal Appreciation is the second week of the month. It is a time to thank your mail person for bringing your mail; wind, rain, or shine. Your child can draw a picture or make a card for him or her. In addition, have your child send a drawing or letter to a friend or relative. Show them the envelope, where to write the return address, where to write the information to the sendee, and where to place the stamp. If you're able to pass by or go into the local post office and show your child where people can pick up their mail, send packages, buy stamps, etc..

The fourth week of the month will celebrate Science; we'll do projects centering around themes such as sinking and floating, liquids and solids, and explore the natural world around us (nature walk).

The last week is Arts and Crafts; we'll be focusing on sensory experiences such as clay, oil and water, tissue paper, and a cooking project.
