

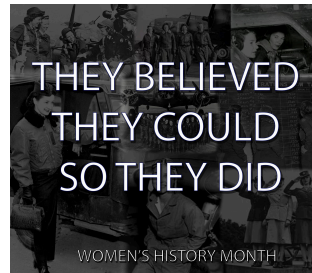

March recognizes many celebrations such as Women's History Month, St. Patrick's Day, and Irish Heritage Month. We will also review letters Oo, Pp, and Qq.

The first full week we will recognize Women's History. This event highlights women's contributions in history and today, it also coincides with International Women's Day which is on March 8th. **We are asking our students to bring in a photo of a woman with a small paragraph explaining who she is and how she has affected our society.**

The second week we will celebrate Irish Heritage and St. Patrick's Day. We will discuss where Ireland is located, what is their culture, language, traditions, and food. On the 14th each class will do a cooking project, please check with your Teachers to find out what ingredient to bring.

The third week of March we will focus on St. Patrick's Day/Irish Heritage Month which commemorates the saint for bringing Christianity to Ireland, but it also celebrates the heritage, culture, and traditions of Ireland. Many parades are held on St. Patrick's Day throughout the United States; there is music, dancing, drinking, and eating. Our lessons will concentrate on the history of Ireland, its geography, language, music, and food. **If you have Irish books or music to share please bring them in to share.**

The next week recognizes Spring which officially begins on March 20th. Often Spring signifies warmer weather, the regrowth of plants and flowers, and longer daylight hours. We'll do some gardening and planting with the children to celebrate the change of seasons.
