Welcome to August! This month's curriculum themes are: International Pirate Week, Fairy Tales & Nursery Rhymes, Friendship, and Be Kind to Humankind. We will also review the shapes: circle, square, triangle rectangle, oval, rhombus, star, and heart.

For International Pirate week we will discuss the origins of Pirates and why they became so popular in literature and movies? We'll talk about the conditions they lived in, where they traveled, and if they ever found treasure on their adventures.

The third week we are using our imagination for Fairy Tales and Nursery Rhymes, what are your favorite stories and rhymes? Fairy Tales were meant to teach children life lessons such as: do not lie (Peter and Wolf), do not speak to strangers (Red Riding Hood), do not judge people's appearance (The Ugly Duckling), and respect others (Goldilocks and the 3 Bears).

Next is Friendship week; what is a friend? How do you make friends, keep them, and what do you like to do with your friends? **Bring in a photo of your child's** friend(s) to share and write about what they like to do together.

Be Kind to Humankind week is a celebration that seeks to make the world a better place and enhance the quality of life for everyone.
